Holiday Cleanup: Un-flocked Christmas trees can be cut to fit into your yard waste bin. The lid must be able to close for your tree to be picked up. Flocked Christmas trees must be disposed in the garbage. Plain gift wrap can be recycled, but gift wrap with foil, glitter, etc. goes in the garbage. Light strings, glass, electronics, foam packaging, and plastic bags/wrap can be dropped off at the recycle center.

Neighborhood Safety: The best way to prevent crime is to get to know your neighbors. Introduce yourself and say hello to neighbors you don't know! They may be the ones to alert you if something is amiss. As always, if you see something suspicious in the neighborhood, call the University Place Police at the nonemergency line: 253-798-4722. If an immediate response is required, always call 911 instead.

Animal Control: Call 253.798.7387, for emergencies after hours call 911. Animal Control responds to all domestic animal calls including lost or stray animals, found or injured animals, aggressive animals, abused animals, animal bites, barking dogs and leash law violations. If you need to report a deceased animal on a roadway or city right-of-way, call public works at 253.460.6493.
